English

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

1. Recall and summarize information from comprehension passages, classify information, and analyze processes in the text.

(Comprehension passage, classification and process analysis)

2. Demonstrate the ability to reference and interpret information from brochures, advertisements, and pictures. (Referencing Skill, Brochure, Advertisements and Picture reading)

3. Analyze and interpret data presented in various formats. (Data Interpretation)

4. Differentiate between listening and hearing, and understand the importance of active listening. (Listening vs. hearing, Non-verbal and Verbal signs of active listening)

5. Engage in listening activities such as listening to pre-recorded audios of interviews and conversations. (Listening Activities)

6. Communicate effectively in spoken English by introducing oneself, others, making requests, offering help, congratulating, making enquiries, and seeking permission. (Introducing oneself, Introducing others, Requests, Offering help Congratulating, Enquiries and Seeking permission)

7. Provide clear and concise instructions for tasks and device usage, as well as give directions. (Giving instructions to do a task and to use a device, Giving Directions)

8. Understand and apply concord, question forms, question tags, derivatives, and linkers in spoken and written English. (Concord, Question Forms, Question Tags, Use of Derivatives, Linkers)

9. Analyze and interpret literary works from the course book, including poems and essays by various authors. (Analysis of literary works from CONFLATIONS-1)

Through engaging in class discussions, completing assignments, and practicing both receptive and productive skills, students will develop a strong foundation in English language comprehension, communication, and critical thinking.
